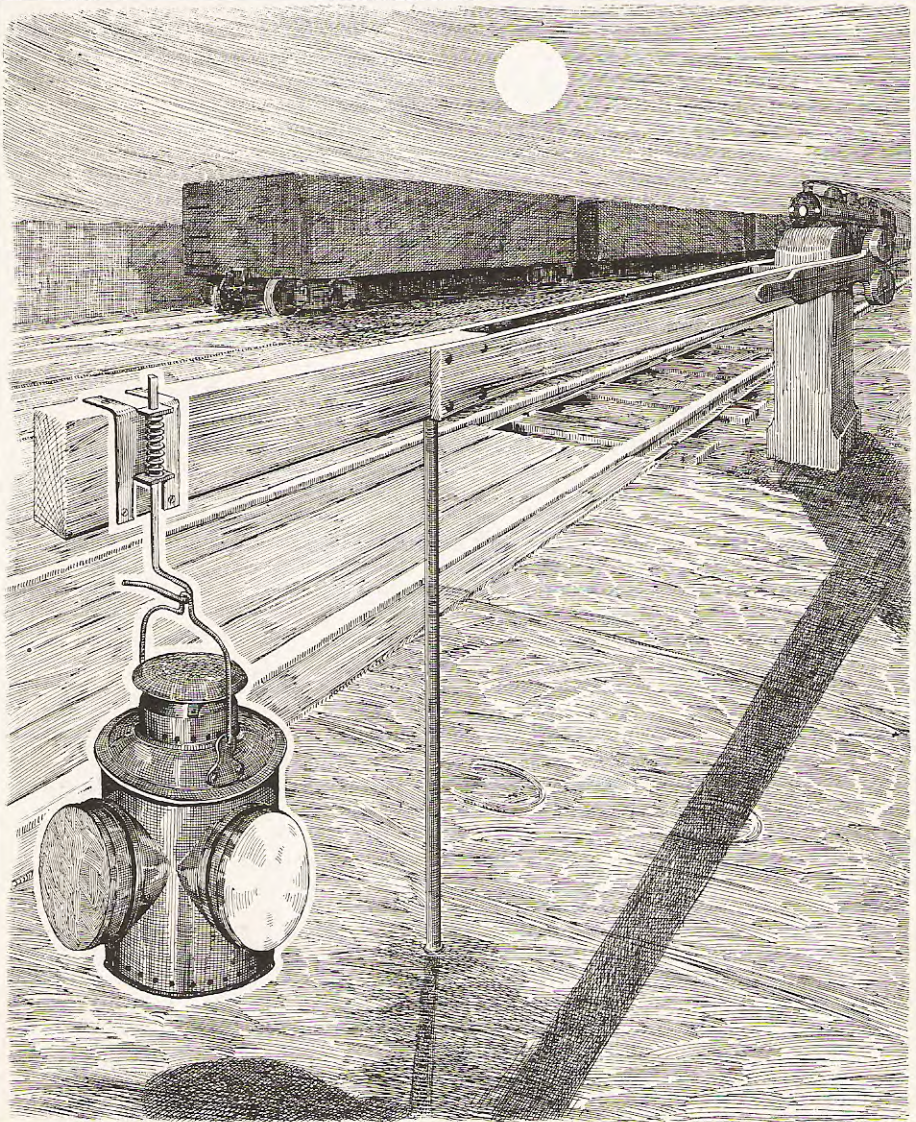

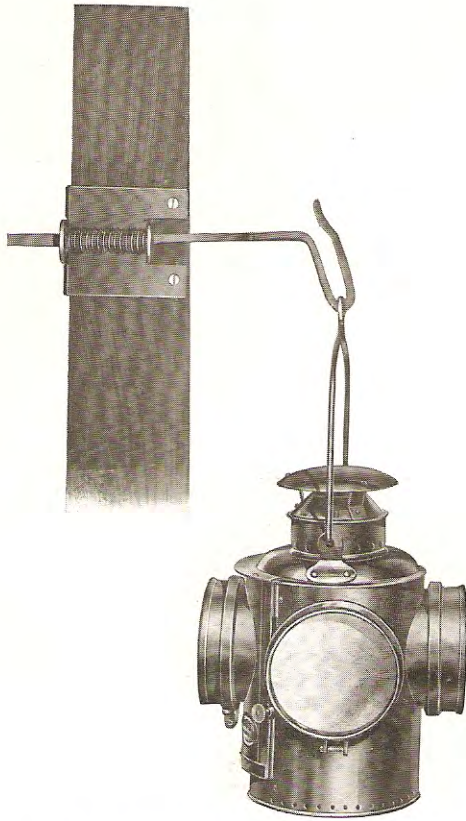


Showing gate in closed position

**ADLAKE CROSSING GATE LAMP No. 52
WITH HANGER No. 1**

One of the problems in connection with Crossing Gate Lamps has been that when the gate is dropped, it comes to a sudden stop when the support meets the street, and this causes the oil in the wick to be jarred down, and if the shock is sufficient, the flame will be extinguished.

In order to guard against this, the Adlake Gate Lamp Hanger No. 1 has been devised, in which a coiled

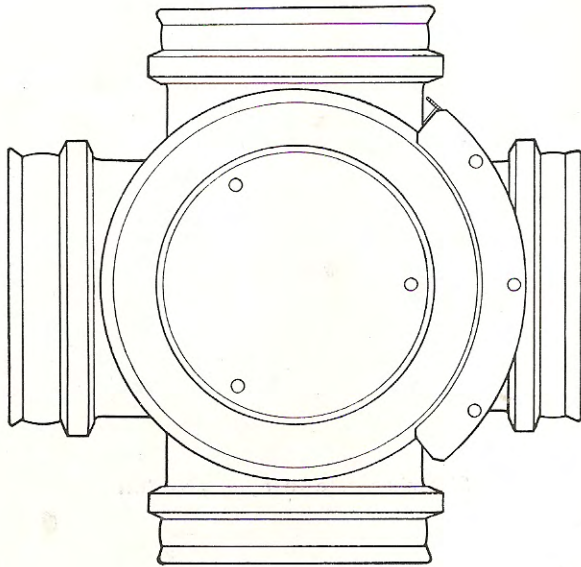


Showing gate in open position

spring of the proper strength relieves the lamp of this blow. The bracket is made of wrought iron in such a form that while the lamp is held securely in place under all service conditions, it may be readily removed for filling and cleaning.

The Gate Lamp shown is the Adlake No. 52, which can be furnished with one, two, or four signal openings and fitted either with roundels or lenses in any colors desired. Blanks can be so arranged that any of the signals can be covered if desired.
